

Cookies Policy

We inform you that at speakingspanishschool.com we use cookies in order to facilitate use and navigation through the website and improve the quality of the page according to the habits and browsing styles of users.

1. What are cookies?

They are files that are downloaded to the user's computer, smartphone or tablet when they access a web page and that allow the owner of said page to store or retrieve certain information on multiple variables, such as; the number of times the page has been visited by the user, ensuring the user's session while browsing the page, etc.

2. Type of cookies

Below is information about the type of cookies and their purpose:

2.1. Types of cookies according to the entity that manages them Depending on who is the entity that manages the equipment or domain from which the cookies are sent and processes the data obtained, we can distinguish:

Own cookies: These are those that are sent to the user's terminal equipment from speakingspanishschool.com

Third-party cookies: These are those that are sent to the user's terminal equipment from a computer or domain that is not managed by the editor, but by another entity that processes the data obtained through cookies, such as www.google.com.

2.2. Types of cookies according to the period of time they remain activated on the computer.

Session cookies: These are a type of cookies designed to collect and store data while the user accesses a web page. These cookies are stored on the terminal until the user's browsing session ends.

Persistent cookies: These are a type of cookies in which the data continues to be stored in the terminal and can be accessed and processed for a period defined by the person responsible for the cookie, which can range from a few minutes to several years.

23. Types of cookies according to their purpose

Technical cookies: They allow the user to navigate through the website or platform and use the different options or services that exist there, such as, for example, controlling traffic and data communication, identifying the session, accessing restricted access parts, use security elements during navigation or store content for the dissemination of videos or sound or share content through social networks. These are session and persistent cookies.

Personalization cookies: They allow the user to access the service with some predefined characteristics based on a series of criteria on the user's terminal, such as the type of browser through which the service is accessed, the regional configuration from which the service is accessed., etc. Third parties such as Google, YouTube or Twitter use this type of persistent personalization cookies regarding their services.

Analytical cookies: These are those that allow us to quantify the number of users and thus carry out the measurement and statistical analysis of the use made by users of our website. To do this, your navigation on our website is analyzed in order to improve it. At cheerfulspanish.com, analytical, proprietary, session and persistent cookies are used for this purpose, specifically Google Analytics cookies that have different expiration periods depending on the information they offer us. Third parties such as Google, YouTube or Twitter also use this type of session and persistent analytical cookies.

3. Who uses cookies?

The information collected through cookies on a website can be used either by the owner of the website or by a third party that provides a service to the owner.

4. Cookie management

Taking into account the information provided through this Cookies Policy, below we offer information on how you can manage the cookies used on cheerfulspanish.com through the different options offered by the most common browsers (Explorer , Firefox and Chrome). If the installation of all cookies on the website is prevented, some of its functionalities, as well as some content, may be affected

4.1. How to view cookies

All browsers offer the user the possibility of searching and viewing the cookies installed by a certain website, obtaining information regarding their duration and the possibility of deleting them, as indicated in the following section. 4.2. How to deactivate or delete cookies

To deactivate, restrict, block or delete cookies, the user must modify the settings of the browser used on their terminal, whether computer, smartphone or tablet. In general, browsers offer the following configuration options in relation to the installation of cookies:

That the browser rejects all cookies and therefore, that no cookie from any web page is installed on your terminal.

Let the browser notify you before the cookie is installed so that you can decide whether or not to accept its installation.

That the browser only rejects third-party cookies from the websites you visit but not those used by the website you browse.

The browsing option in private mode through which cookies are installed on the terminal but are automatically deleted when browsing the website ends:
